



CyberPower Gamer Infinity 7500

Summary: The Gamer Infinity 7500 is a fast desktop with impressive upgrade possibilities and it wins our Editor's Choice Award for scalability and speed

Throughout the last several years, we've had the opportunity to review many computer systems that are aimed at fulfilling the performance requirements of serious gamers. SLI (scalable link interface) technology that was developed by NVIDIA rewrote the book on graphics speeds by providing the ability to tie two different graphics adapters together for amazing performance that usually supersedes the capabilities of monitors and flat panel display. As the name indicates, CyberPower builds their computers with parts specifically designed to meet the needs of their users. While Gamer Infinity 7500's base model is quite affordable, there are configuration possibilities that will make it more impressive and this desktop receives our Editor's Choice Award for scalability and speed.

This particular model only uses Intel's Core 2 Duo processors with the exception of an upgrade that implements the Core 2 Quad Q6600 CPU. Processor speeds range between 1.86 to 2.93GHz and the base model uses the 2.4Ghz E6700CPU with 4MB of shared Level 2 cache. 1GB of PC6400 DDR2 SDRAM comes with this system and depending on the motherboard chose, can handle up to a total of 4GB.

It can even take advantage of NVIDIA's SLI dual-video card technology

A fast 7200-RPM 320GB SATA-II hard drive is the standard choice with space available for a second drive with RAID capabilities. The company also builds the system with Sony's 18X Q170A Dual Layer DVD+/-RW optical drive to burn music, data and video discs.

Gamer Infinity 7500 desktop include an integrated 7.1 SoundBlaster-compatible high definition audio system with two 120-watt stereo speakers. The standard 10/100Base-T Ethernet card is shipped with the unit but for a little extra you can bump that up to a 1Gbps adapter. If you've adapted wireless communications in your location, several different Wi-Fi products can be ordered with the system. A 12-in-1 memory card reader imports images in a wide variety of formats. While the company preinstalls Windows Vista Home Edition on this computer, both Business and Ultimate versions can be ordered with this desktop.



If you're a serious gamer looking for a new computer, then consider the CyberPower Gamer Infinity 7500 Desktop. The base model starts out at \$849, which leaves you with plenty leeway to consider upgrades for this particular system. There are many flat panel displays to choose from CyberPower's online store but make sure you select one that can meet with the performance of the graphics adapter. The base model comes with a single NVIDIA GeForce 7900 GS video card with 256MB of video memory. The good news is that you can order it with one of many configurations NVIDIA's GeForce 7950 or 8800 video cards. With a second PCI Express slot available for the video, you can take advantage of the graphics processing power of SLI technology if you want to pay the price.
